



# Foodscape Design Basics



- Draw a plan to scale
- Select trees, shrubs and perennials for structure
- Focus on open, sunny areas in existing landscape
- Rotate crops seasonally
- Utilize cover crops
- Focus on diversity not monoculture planting
- Devote budget to quality compost seasonally



## How to Foodscape?





#### Sunlight:

**FULL SUN= 8+ hours** 

PART SUN = 4-6 hours

SHADE= 4 hours or less

#### Water:

DAILY = site close to hose!

WEEKLY = once established



Other Solanceous crops:


- Potato (Solanum tuberosum)

- Tomatillio (Physalis ixocarpa)






Space 8-12" apart


Water as needed






## The Potato Story







#### Solanaceae plants have poisonous foliage






## Plant NOW in March Harvest in mid June



#### Hard neck vs Soft neck Garlic







Hard neck Garlic	Soft neck Garlic
Has a hard stem	Has a soft stalk
Impossible to braid	Easy to cut and braid
Bulbs are regular in shaped	Bulbs are imperfectly shaped
Has a powerful flavor	Has a mild flavor



## 12' bed edge produced 18 bulbs... 6 months worth of garlic!







