In addition to the usual weeding, we have spread pine tags for mulch in the garden provided by Drew Therrien and the other Rangers. A group of Archeologists have begun excavating the foundation for the original Washington home. They were able to outline the foundation by using ground sonar. Part of the fence surrounding the garden has been removed so we are waiting to see if any of the farm animals pay us a visit. The Birthplace has promised to give us new permanent plant markers to replace the wooden markers. Our hope is that they will be in place for the NNMG visit in July. Our next project will be to identify some of the plants that are on our plant map but seem to have either traveled or just plain gone MIA. We will also be planting the annual herbs. The garlic that was planted last fall is doing well, along with the Arum metallicum, perennial begonia, and Callicarpas.

The crew worked with Lindeve to get the garden ready for the dedication of the East Garden in mid April. The Garden Club of Virginia officially dedicated the garden (they had funded its restoration). We cancelled our early May time at Stratford since the gardener was on vacation.
