Heather Holm, a biologist, pollinator conservationist, and awardwinning author, will speak about the pollination of native plants as well as the importance of attracting bees and beneficial insects to your fruit and vegetable garden. Heather's expertise includes the interactions between native pollinators and native plants, and the natural history and biology of native bees and predatory wasps. Heather is the author of four books, including *Pollinators of Native Plants* and *Common Native Bees of the Eastern United States*.
